Dear Unit-holders,

We are pleased to present you the following report for ABW ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING – Investmentfonds in Abwicklung for the accounting year from 1 June 2025 to 31 May 2026.

The Fund was formed solely for the purpose of winding up the illiquid assets stemming from the segregation of ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING.

Please note that all assets with the exception of the demand deposits are illiquid, so all calculated values and performance figures are based on indicative valuations. The actual liquidation proceeds after the sale of all transferable securities may deviate from the indicative calculated value significantly.

Due to requirements under European law, the Fund Rules were amended relating to liquidity management for the Fund. In addition to the previously established option of suspending unit certificate transactions and/or segregating fund assets, the Management Company has additionally defined the following liquidity management tools for the protection of Unit-holders' interests: redemption restrictions and an extension of the redemption notice period. The simultaneous application of selected liquidity management tools is permitted if required to protect Unit-holders' interests.

Information about the Liquidation

The segregation of ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING pursuant to § 65 InvFG 2011 was completed as of 7 October 2022. Unit-holders will be informed of the segregation pursuant to § 65 (1) in conjunction with § 136 (4) InvFG 2011. The liquidation of the Fund by the Management Company commenced on 8 October 2022. The Austrian Financial Market Authority ("FMA") approved this split-off as requested in a decision dated 23 June 2022 and bearing the identifier FMA-IF25 4223/0001-INV/2022.

The split off UCITS "ABW ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING – Investmentfonds in Abwicklung" is currently in liquidation.

Following the termination, the Management Company is legally obligated to convert the fund assets to cash as quickly as is possible while protecting the interests of the Unit-holders, i.e. to wind up the Fund and distribute the liquidation proceeds to the Unit-holders. For the reasons described above (EU sanctions, restrictions on trading), it is not possible to provide detailed information on the future timing of payments of liquidation proceeds or the expected total duration of the liquidation process at this time.

Portfolio report

Due to the EU sanctions in effect against Russia and against Russian banks and central depositaries, and due to the Russian sanctions against investors from "unfriendly" jurisdictions including Austria, transactions with Russian securities and asset transfers are not possible on the exchange in Moscow or OTC.

The fund manager still has no access to securities or cash accounts at the depositary bank in Russia.

No changes could be made to the holdings during the reporting period. There are still 17 Russian equity positions for which we can conduct no transactions and a cash position (also as a reserve to cover the ongoing, legally required costs of the liquidation, e.g. auditing fees) in the Fund as of the end of the reporting period. The Russian government is the majority shareholder in only two of these, Gazprom and the Moscow Exchange. During the reporting period, a number of Russian companies including Surgutneftegas, Tatneft, Polyus, Lukoil, Moscow Exchange, Novatek, and Mobile TeleSystems distributed dividends in Moscow. At the time this report was prepared, if and when a transfer of these earnings or holdings will be possible remains uncertain due to the ongoing sanctions.

The fund management is following the legal situation on the market and the corporate reports with all due attention to be able to react swiftly and appropriately to any new developments, as far as action is possible.

As soon as conditions allow and the liquidation of individual holdings or the entire Fund is possible, the Management Company will try to determine the timing and procedure for the disposal of the Russian assets with all due care and in the best interests of all Unit-holders.

Market

The stock index of the Moscow Exchange (RTS) rose by 2.20% in USD during the reporting period. Including dividend disbursements, the RTSI Total Return Index posted a performance of plus 10.10% (also in USD). The market capitalisation of the RTS Index came to USD 95.99 billion at the end of the reporting period.

Materials companies in particular delivered some of the strongest performance in the portfolio, including Polyus Gold (plus 37.02%) and Norilsk Nickel (plus 31.18%). The Moscow Exchange (plus 3.61%) and Mobile TeleSystems (plus 16.19%) also turned in a positive performance. Results were mixed in the energy sector. While Novatek (plus 7.89%) posted gains, Lukoil (minus 19.75%), Surgutneftegas (minus 5.64%), Tatneft (minus 5.23%), and Gazprom (minus 3.50%) were weaker.

Names including Alrosa (minus 40.34%) and the steel companies Novolipetsk (minus 24.99%) and Severstal (minus 24.17%) lagged well behind the overall market trend (source: Moscow Exchange, performance data in USD).

The Russian rouble appreciated by roughly 5.94% versus the euro during the reporting period on the back of expected negotiations with Ukraine and higher energy prices. The exchange rate was 82.7160 RUB per EUR at the end of the period (source: Bloomberg).

It must be noted that foreign investors still do not have access to equity or FX trading on the Russian exchange. In addition, trading in Russian securities remains suspended at international exchanges such as London and Frankfurt.

Principles governing performance-based remuneration components

The Management Company has adopted remuneration principles to prevent possible conflicts of interest and to ensure compliance with the standard rules of conduct when awarding remuneration to relevant persons.

Fixed salary components make up a large enough share of the total remuneration of all employees of the Management Company that a variable remuneration policy can be applied on an individualised basis.

The total remuneration (fixed and variable components) is governed by the principle of balance and is linked to sustainability so that the acceptance of excessive risks is not rewarded. Therefore, the variable remuneration forms no more than a balanced portion of the total remuneration awarded to an employee.

The performance-based remuneration components serve the short-term and long-term interests of the Management Company and contribute to preventing risky behaviour. The performance-based remuneration components take into account individual performance as well as the profitability of the Management Company.

The size of the bonus pool is calculated based on the bonus potential that can be applied to the different employee categories. Bonus potential is a percentage of the fixed annual gross remuneration. The bonus potential can be no more than 100% of the fixed annual gross remuneration. The bonus pool is adjusted depending on the success of the Management Company. The personal bonus is linked to individual performance. The total of personal bonuses is limited by the size of the bonus pool after deduction of penalties.

The performance-based payments are capped at 100% of the annual gross remuneration for all employees, including the material risk bearers (according to the definition in the remuneration policy) and managing directors of the Management Company.

The remuneration system is made up of three components:

- 1) Fixed remuneration
- 2) Variable remuneration
- 3) Fringe benefits

The bonus potential is based on the fixed annual gross remuneration. The target agreements concluded with the employees contain qualitative and/or quantitative objectives. The payment of performance-based remuneration components is subject to a minimum profitability level for the Management Company and to performance targets.

Sixty per cent of the performance-based remuneration components are paid immediately; for employees who are involved directly in fund and portfolio management, 50% of this is paid immediately in cash and 50% is paid one year later in the form of non-cash instruments. The remaining 40% of the performance-based remuneration components are retained and paid out over a period of three years, with 50% of this also being paid in cash and 50% in the form of non-cash instruments for employees who are involved directly in fund and portfolio management. The non-cash instruments can consist of units in an investment fund that is administered by the Management Company, equivalent holdings or instruments linked to units, or equivalent non-cash instruments. Based on the principle of proportionality, the Management Company has set a materiality threshold below which there is no incentive to enter into inappropriate risks, for which reason there is no need to make delayed payment or payment in the form of a non-cash instrument. Other non-cash benefits are fringe benefits that are not associated with performance but with a specific position (e.g. company car) or that apply for all employees (e.g. holiday).

The Supervisory Board of the Management Company has set up a Remuneration Committee to ensure that the remuneration policy and its application are independently assessed. This committee consists of the following persons: Rudolf Sagmeister, Harald Gasser (remuneration expert), and Heinrich Hubert Reiner.

The last audit of compliance with the requirements of the remuneration policy by the Supervisory Board in March 2025 revealed no deviations. There were also no material findings during the last audit by the Internal Auditing department.

No material changes were made to the remuneration policy during the past accounting year.

Audit Report*

Audit opinion

We have audited the liquidation report prepared by Erste Asset Management GmbH, Vienna, for the fund under its management

ABW ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING – Investmentfonds in Abwicklung
jointly owned fund in liquidation pursuant to the InvFG,

consisting of the statement of assets and liabilities as of 31 May 2026, the income statement for the accounting year ending on this date, and the other information specified in Annex I Schedule B of the Austrian Investment Fund Act 2011 (InvFG 2011).

Based on the findings of our audit, we believe that the liquidation report satisfies the legal requirements and provides a true and fair view of the assets and financial position as of 31 May 2026 and of the earnings position of the fund for the accounting year ending on this date in accordance with the provisions of the InvFG 2011.

Basis for the audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with § 49 (5) InvFG 2011 and in accordance with the Austrian principles of good auditing. These principles require the application of the International Standards on Auditing (ISA). Our responsibilities under these regulations and standards are described in the section “Responsibilities of the auditor in auditing the liquidation report” of our audit report. We are independent from the company as specified by the Austrian commercial and industry regulations and fulfilled our other professional obligations in accordance with these requirements. We feel that the audit evidence that we obtained up to the date of the audit report is sufficient and suitable to serve as a basis for our audit opinion as of that date.

Emphasis of a matter

We would like to draw your attention to the statement by the management of the Management Company on pages 4 and 5 of the liquidation report, in which the management indicates that the fund is in liquidation and points out that the valuation is indicative due to the illiquidity of the securities holdings and the associated valuation characteristics of the fund and that the actual liquidation proceeds may deviate from the indicative calculated value significantly. The audit opinion is not modified with regard to this matter.

Other information

The legal representatives are responsible for the other information. The other information includes all information in the liquidation report except for the statement of assets and liabilities, the income statement, the other information specified in Annex I Schedule B of the InvFG 2011, and the audit report.

Our audit opinion does not cover this other information, and we provide no assurance whatsoever for this other information.

In the context of our review of the liquidation report, we are responsible for reading this other information and assessing whether the other information contains material inconsistencies with the liquidation report or with the information gathered by us during our audit, or appears to contain other manners of material misstatements.

Should we come to the conclusion on the basis of the work completed with the other information received before the date of this audit report that this other information contains a material misstatement, we are required to report about this fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management and supervisory board responsibilities relating to the liquidation report

The legal representatives are responsible for preparing the liquidation report and for ensuring that this report provides a true and fair view of the assets and financial and earnings position of the fund in accordance with the provisions of the InvFG 2011. The legal representatives are also responsible for implementing the internal controls that they deem necessary to facilitate the preparation of a liquidation report that is free from material misstatements due to error or fraud.

The supervisory board is responsible for the independent review of the financial reporting process of the company as regards the fund under its management in accordance with § 14 (3) InvFG.

Responsibilities of the auditor in auditing the liquidation report

Our goals are to ascertain with sufficient certainty whether the liquidation report contains material misstatements due to error or fraud and to issue an audit certificate that includes our audit opinion. Sufficient certainty is a high degree of certainty but no guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the Austrian standards on good auditing, which require the application of the ISA, will always discover material misstatements that may be present. Misstatements can result from fraud or errors and are considered to be material when it can be reasonably expected that individual misstatements or a combination of misstatements can influence economic decisions made by readers on the basis of this liquidation report.

As part of an audit conducted in accordance with the Austrian standards on good auditing, which require the application of the ISA, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism during the entire audit process.

In addition:

- We identify and assess the risks of material misstatements in the liquidation report due to error or fraud, plan audit steps in response to these risks, perform the planned audit steps, and collect audit evidence that is sufficient and suitable to form a basis for our audit opinion. The risk that a material misstatement resulting from fraud will remain undiscovered is greater than for misstatements resulting from error because fraudulent activity can include collusion, the falsification of documents, intentional incomplete or misleading representations, and the circumvention of internal controls.
- We familiarise ourselves with the internal controls that are relevant for the audit to plan audit steps that are appropriate under the specific circumstances, but not so as to state an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal controls.

- We assess the appropriateness of the accounting methods applied by the legal representatives and the reasonableness of the estimates made by the legal representatives in the accounts and of the associated information.
- We assess the overall presentation, structure, and content of the liquidation report including the figures as well as whether the liquidation report depicts the underlying transactions and events in a manner that provides a true and fair view.
- We discuss the planned scope and scheduling of the audit and any material audit findings, including material defects that we discover in the internal controls during our audit, with the supervisory board, among other issues.

Fund Rules

The Fund Rules for ABW ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING – Investmentfonds in Abwicklung (the “Fund” or “split off UCITS” in the following) were approved by the Austrian Financial Market Authority (FMA).

The split off UCITS is being formed in accordance with § 65 InvFG 2011 as amended solely for the purpose of winding up the illiquid portions stemming from the segregation of ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING. The split off UCITS is being wound up by the depositary bank (Article 2).

Article 1 Fund Units

The joint ownership of the fund assets is evidenced by certificates having the characteristics of a bearer unit.

The unit certificates are depicted in separate global certificates for each unit category. For this reason, individual unit certificates cannot be issued.

Article 2 Depositary Bank (Depositary)

The depositary bank (depositary) appointed for the Fund as well as the party processing the liquidation pursuant to § 63 InvFG is Erste Group Bank AG, Vienna.

The payment offices for unit certificates are the depositary bank (depositary).

Article 3 Investment Instruments and Principles

The Fund is being formed solely for the purpose of winding up the illiquid assets stemming from the segregation of ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING.

Beyond this, no assets may be selected in accordance with the InvFG.

In accordance with §§ 63 in conjunction with 65 InvFG 2011, the illiquid portions must be converted into cash and paid out to the Unit-holders as quickly as is possible while protecting the interests of the investors.

Article 4 Issue and Redemption Procedure

Provided that the value of the Fund is measurable, the unit value shall be calculated in the currency of the respective unit category.

Issue and redemption

For unit certificates in ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING issued on the date of the segregation, unit certificates of the same unit category shall be issued in the Fund free of charge on the date of the segregation in the amount of the issued units in the fund from which the segregation is being made, multiplied by the applicable segregation ratio.

This shall convey the same proportionate joint ownership in the split off UCITS as the underlying unit certificate conveyed in ERSTE STOCK EUROPE EMERGING on the date of the segregation.

No units will be issued beyond this because the Fund is in liquidation pursuant to § 63 in conjunction with § 65 InvFG.

Because the split off UCITS is in liquidation pursuant to § 63 in conjunction with § 65 InvFG, the redemption of units is not possible.

Article 5 Accounting Year

The accounting year of the Fund is from 1 June to 31 May.

Article 6 Use of Earnings

The following unit categories and the corresponding certificates shall be issued for the Fund in the same manner they are issued for ERSTE STOCK EUROPE

EMERGING on the date of the segregation: dividend-bearing units, non-dividend-bearing units with capital gains tax withholding, and non-dividend-bearing units without capital gains tax withholding.

Use of earnings for dividend-bearing units

The earnings generated during the accounting year (interest and dividends) less all costs can be distributed as deemed appropriate by the Management Company. Dividend disbursement may be omitted in the interests of the Unit-holders. Dividends may also be disbursed at the discretion of the Management Company from earnings generated by the sale of fund assets, including subscription rights. Disbursements of fund assets and interim dividends may be paid. Capital repayments are possible at any time. The fund assets are also permitted to fall below the legally stipulated minimum volume for termination as a result of such dividend disbursements and capital repayments.

The amounts shall be paid to the holders of dividend-bearing units on or after 1 September of the following accounting year. The remaining amount shall be carried forward.

An amount calculated in accordance with the InvFG must also be paid out on or after 1 September to cover the capital gains tax assessed by the tax authorities on the dividend-equivalent earnings from the fund units unless the Management Company provides suitable proof from the banks managing the corresponding securities accounts that the unit certificates can only be held by Unit-holders who are not subject to Austrian personal income tax or corporation tax or who meet the conditions for exemption from capital gains tax according to § 94 of the Austrian Income Tax Act (Einkommensteuergesetz) at the time of payment.

Use of earnings for non-dividend-bearing units with capital gains tax payment (non-dividend-bearing units)

The earnings generated by the Fund during the accounting year less all costs will not be paid out. In the case of non-dividend-bearing units, an amount calculated in accordance with the InvFG must be paid out on or after 1 September to cover the capital gains tax assessed by the tax authorities on the dividend-equivalent earnings from the fund units unless the Management Company provides suitable proof from the banks managing the corresponding securities accounts that the unit certificates can only be held by Unit-holders who are not subject to Austrian personal income tax or corporation tax or who meet the conditions for exemption from capital gains tax according to § 94 of the Austrian Income Tax Act (Einkommensteuergesetz) at the time of payment.

Capital repayments are possible at any time. The fund assets are also permitted to fall below the legally stipulated minimum volume for termination as a result of such capital repayments.

Use of earnings for non-dividend-bearing units without capital gains tax payment (KESt-exempt non-dividend-bearing units)

The earnings generated by the Fund during the accounting year less all costs will not be paid out. No payment pursuant to the InvFG will be made. The reference date for the exemption from KESt payment for the profit for the year for the purposes of the InvFG shall be 1 September of the following accounting year.

The Management Company shall provide suitable proof from the banks managing the corresponding securities accounts that the unit certificates could only be held by Unit-holders who are not subject to Austrian personal income tax or corporation tax or who met the conditions for exemption from capital gains tax according to § 94 of the Austrian Income Tax Act (Einkommensteuergesetz) at the time of payment.

If these requirements are not met at the time of payment, the amount calculated pursuant to the InvFG must be paid out by the credit institution managing the respective securities account.

Capital repayments are possible at any time. The fund assets are also permitted to fall below the legally stipulated minimum volume for termination as a result of such capital repayments.

Article 7 Compensation for Expenses, Liquidation Fee

The depositary bank shall be entitled to compensation for all expenses incurred in its liquidation activities, especially costs for mandatory publications, custodial fees, expenses for administrative activities pursuant to § 5 (2) 1 lit b) InvFG, auditing and consulting costs, and costs for the preparation of period-end financial statements.

The depositary bank shall be entitled to compensation for all expenses incurred in the liquidation of the Fund.

Upon payment of the liquidation proceeds, the depositary bank will receive a fee of up to 0.5% of the amount that is paid out.

Note regarding the data used

The sections Income Statement and Changes in Fund Assets, Statement of Assets and Liabilities and Details and Explanation of Tax Treatment in this annual report were prepared on the basis of data from the depositary bank for the Fund.

The data and information provided by the depositary bank were collected with the greatest possible care and were checked solely for plausibility.
